What's the Challenge?

All children and young people have rights. And everyone under 18 has a right to know their rights!

Sally Holland, the Children's Commissioner for Wales, challenges you to deliver training about children's rights in your school so that other young people know about their rights and also know that Sally's job is to help children in Wales experience their rights.
