Your Rights Mission is to plan a Haf o Hwyl activity for your group or community.

Your Haf o Hwyl activity could be a **small event** or a **whole day of activities**. Your activity shouldn't cost a lot of money or need new equipment.

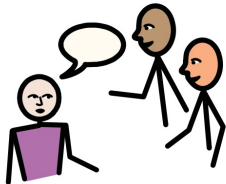
Work with your group leader/ youth worker to decide what would work best for your group.



In this mission you will be thinking about different children's rights:



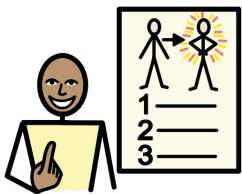
Article 2 - All children have these rights



Article 12 - I have the right to be listened to, and taken seriously



Article 15 - I have the right to meet with friends and join groups



Article 29 - I have the right to be the best that I can be



Article 31 - I have the right to relax and play

Before you start planning:

Think about any barriers there might be to running an activity.

Think about how you can include everyone in the activity.

There are **3 parts** to our activity pack to help you plan:

Part 1: Gathering Ideas

You might want to ask other members of your group or community **to give you their ideas for a Haf o Hwyl activity.**

You could work with your group leader/ youth worker to think about how you could make this happen in your group. This could include:

- Holding a vote
- Asking members of your group to fill in an online survey
- Working with other groups in your local area



Part 2: Planning

Once you've gathered ideas from your peers, you need to start planning your event.

It would be a good idea to present your initial ideas to your group leader/ youth worker, to make sure it's possible.

Here are some ideas for how you can share your initial ideas:

- Make a Power-point
- Elevator pitch - this is where you present your ideas in under 2 minutes

Your group leader/ youth worker will be able to help you make sure the activities can happen, and help you contact anyone you might need.
