Planning your rights journey

Follow this plan if you have done lots of work on children's rights.

- 1. Draw your road map. At the start of the road add the year you started learning about rights and at the end of the road add the year 2022.
- 2. Look at our list of Rights Activities and add the ones your school has done to your road map.
 - * If you haven't done a Rights Activity yet you could choose some you'd like to try in the future and add them to your road.
- 3. Think about your favourite Rights Activity and add it to your map. Make sure you explain why it was your favourite.
- 4. Next, draw an "Imagination Station" and write the most creative thing you've done to learn about rights. This could be a display you've made; a game you've created or an event you've held.
 - * If you haven't started learning about rights yet, then you could think about something you would like to create for everyone in your school.
- 5. Think about your "Three Stars and a Wish". This is three things you think you do well and one thing you would like to do next to learn about children's rights in your school.
