

<u>Calendar of Rights</u> – this shows an example of some rights you can use each month

Month	A Child's Right - your right to	Link to calendar
September	To learn and to go to school (Article 28)	Start of the school year
October	To say what you think should happen and be listened to (Article 12)	This can coincide with school council and eco committee elections
November	To not be harmed and be looked after and kept safe (Article 36 + 19)	Links to Bonfire Night, Road Safety Week and Anti- bullying Week
December	To follow your own religion (Article 14)	Christmas and the opportunity to discuss other religious festivals
January	To be the best that you can be (Article 29)	New Year promises and Martin Luther King Day
February	To meet with your friends and join groups and clubs (Article 15)	Valentine's Day / Chinese New Year
March	To a name and nationality (Article 7)	St David's Day, this can also be used as a hook to celebrate a range of names and nationalities
April/May	Right to be as healthy as possible (article 24)	World Health Day and Mental health awareness week



June/July	To relax and play (Article 31)	International Day of Play Summer Fun / Sports Day / Fun & Fitness Week
August	To relax and play (Article 31)	Play day
