October's Monthly Matter is about where our vegetables grow, and whether we should have more locally grown vegetables in schools!


































1) Discuss in pairs or as a group:

Some ideas of pros and cons:

Pros:

good for the planet because your food has less distance to travel and isn't taking precious resources, like water, from other countries

good for the local economy and Welsh producers because we will be spending money on vegetables that stays in Wales

good for the future of food in Wales because if there is more demand for Welsh Vegetables, Wales will grow more veg, and then won't rely so much on other countries.

Cons: If we only eat seasonal and locally grown food in school there might be times of the year where you can't eat your favourite fruit or vegetable in school
